

The point of departure is Hannah Ma's interest in searching for swarm intelligence within performative processes and the intersection of natural and cultural spaces with viral identities including traces of the mythical in our society. In line with the motto _Transition ins WIR (Transition into the WE), the publication becomes a place of exchange, learning and growth between representatives of the performing arts, the increasingly hybrid and diverse performance scene and a "new", expanded audience.



It discusses in interviews and portraits with various representatives of the art and cultural scene how we can reflect on ourselves, our work, our actions, on our task(s) and our position in (consumer) society during this time. What does it mean to be an artist in a capitalist system in times of crisis? Does this reflection matter? Do artists have to become more economical, more capitalistic, think, act capitalistic? The possibility of including digital content in the publication creates a documentary Gesamtkunstwerk – a complemented and completed body of art. People United magazine turns into a _Performing Arts Festival on paper. Coupled with a digital version, the concept makes artistic work and information about the current situation of artists visible and accessible.
